Clothing Swap: Participate in a clothing swap event in your area. Bring unwanted clothes and swap for other items for free. You can also ask friends and family if they have any

clothes to swap or borrow.

Search for a clothing swap group or event on MeetUp. Other keywords to use: Meet Up: Clothes Swap, Fashion Clothes Exchange, Clothes Swapping and Bargain

Hunters.

When in doubt, shop the sale! Here are my top three tips for finding the best bargain deals!

- Hit up garage sales! Go in the late afternoon or early evening to find the best deals, when people are willing to give away items that didn't sell earlier in the day. Check out sites like Yard Sale Search or GarageSale.com to find ones happening in your hometown.
- Get thrifty! Thrift stores typically sell donated items at a much more affordable price than 2. major retailers. Search for thrift stores in your area, and be sure to look for consignment and resale shops as well.
- Swap out the old for the new! Go to swap meets or flea markets in your area to find great bargains or trade in old items for new ones. Happy bargain shopping!





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
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
